## 2020: Our Year in Numbers...

Amidst a global pandemic, and numerous other significant trials faced by our field teams, our operation has naturally had to change and adapt. Yet, we have been amazed time and time again by the Lord's kindness, His provision, and His ability to bear fruit through our work. Here are just some of the highlights from our work over the past year, in numbers and stories.





### Ree\*, Nisa'a

Suddenly divorced and a single mother, Ree found herself overwhelmed with pain. Women in the Arab world are held responsible for holding a marriage together, and are blamed when things go wrong. But after attending 18 weeks of our post-divorce stress course, her life was transformed from the inside out. She now is trained to lead the course to help other women like her.



"Now I am able to help other women and give them hope in the future just like Nisa'a did with me: it gave me hope and transformed my life."

### Anah\*, school cook during a filmmaking workshop

A schoolgirl who bullied the kitchen staff began to identify with their struggles as she interviewed the cook for her film. At the end of the workshop, this girl brought a very expensive perfume bottle to Anah as a sign of her appreciation.



"What happened? The girl who was bullying us is now helping us and defending us against anyone else who tries to bully any of the staff!"

### Camila\*, Future Leaders graduate

Camila attended our Future Leaders training course (run online due to Covid-19). She is now committed to taking what she has learned not only about media, but the importance of leadership, to her church.



"I have heard an important message, and I decided to teach what I have learned about leadership to those I serve at my church."

#### Did you know?

- The MENA region is made up of 19 distinct nations, but within these there are at least 580 unique people groups with their own cultures, dialects and traditions.
- As many as 390 of these groups are classified as unreached, meaning that less than 5% are professing Christians, and there are inadequate local resources available for evangelism.\*
- The majority of Christian media in the region is produced in only two countries, and by Christians from a Christian background, not those from a Muslim background.

## Experience & research shows that media is most effective when it is curated by those within its target audience.

By establishing and shepherding new media teams, we hope to enable New Church (NC) believers from a Muslim background to reach their own communities in culturally-relevant ways with the Gospel. Funds raised through our Christmas appeal will go towards seeding the first of our new teams in Libya. Around 0.5% of Libya's 6.7 million total population are Christians, but there are approximately only 150 Christians who are of Libyan nationality (rather than migrants)\*\*. The need here is evident, and this situation is found similarly in many other nations in the region.

## **Praise Report:**

We're familiar with the idea that following Jesus incurs a great cost, but this primarily looks like denying worldly comforts for many of us in the West. We don't tend to live our daily Christian lives under the constant threat of imprisonment, violence, or death. Living for Jesus in the UK rarely results in ostracisation, manipulation and abuse from our families. When we turn up to church on a Sunday, we aren't treated as suspected spies by brothers and sisters. Gathering for church isn't marked with concern of being discovered by oppressive governments.

This is the reality for the majority of New Church (NC) believers coming from a Muslim background in the Middle East. Believing the Gospel, in some ways, is the easiest part. Navigating the way through life as a Christian believer is a road paved with deep emotional tension, confusion and struggle. Many NC believers in this region come to faith with an already trauma-laden past, too, from backgrounds of abuse, trafficking, warfare and poverty.



Opportunities to confront emotional hurts and encounter the tranformative work of the Holy Spirit are rare. This is why events such as the Inner Healing Conference, attended by nearly 50 individuals from across the entire region and run by our Gulf team at the end of December, are so important.
